

#### **Obituary for Kathleen Lusted of Kettleburgh**

Kathleen Lusted, Kettleburgh's oldest resident, died towards the end of March, aged 101 years. The following is the tribute read out by her nephew, Graham Upson. The funeral was taken by Rev Canon Deirdre Parmenter at Seven Hills Crematorium and those present were invited back to the Chequers for refreshments.

I would like to say a few words about Kathleen or as I knew her Aunt Kit.

Kit was born in Dovercourt to David and Jessie Ramsey on the 4th July 1921, a younger sister to my mother Ruth. Her childhood was spent in Dovercourt where she attended local primary and secondary schools. After leaving school Kit trained as a shorthand typist and at the age of 19 in January 1940 she joined the WRNS. She was first stationed in Aldeburgh and then on to Greenwich. In 1944 Kit was drafted to Algiers to serve on the staff of Admiral Geoffrey Miles as his personal assistant and shorthand typist. Her last posting was to Gibraltar, where she was finally discharged from the WRNS in January 1946 after serving for 6 years.

After leaving the WRNS Kit returned to Dovercourt and lived with my parents Ruth and Jim and myself Graham. She trained as a teacher but soon returned to secretarial and administrative duties as her shyness and nerves got the better of her.

Eventually Kit ended up working at Dovercourt Secondary Modern School in administration as the school secretary, a post which she held for 2 and a half years.

Early in 1951 Kit took the position of assistant purser with the Merchant Navy on the Steam Ship Ranchi sailing to Australia. On board she met her husband to be, Peter Lusted, who was known as Dickie to family and friends. He had to ask her 3 times to marry him, Kit was reluctant as she was 8 years older than him. She agreed on the third occasion, on the condition that they were married in Australia so none of their friends would know the difference in their ages! They were married in Penshurst, Australia on 29th March 1952. As married couples were not allowed to serve on the same ship in the Merchant Navy they did not renew their commissions and started looking for new jobs and a house.

Their first home was a thatched cottage in Campsea Ashe. Dickie got a job as a cost accountant for Burton Son & Sanders in Ipswich and Kit as a secretary at the American School at RAF Bentwaters. She had to cycle there and back each day as they had no car. For a while they moved to Norfolk as Dickie was promoted to office manager of the Norwich Branch of Burton Son & Sanders. Kit joined the staff of the Norfolk Federation of Womens Institutes as their secretary.

Dickies appointment with Framlingham Farmers took them back to Suffolk, living temporarily at Wilby Manor while they were house hunting. After 16 months they found a plot of land and had their bungalow built, which they called Manly. It was built with an office adjacent so that Kit, who was now also working for Framlingham Farmers as their secretary, did not have far to go to work, and we all thought working from home was a new idea, Kit was clearly ahead of her time. Then in 1965 the board of members of Framlingham Farmers moved the office to Framlingham.

After the exodus of Framlingham Farmers from Manly, Dickie and Kit explored many possibilities of working for themselves like a small hotel or a teashop and they finally settled on a crystal and china shop, which they opened in Framlingham just before Christmas in 1965. Sadly around Easter 1966 after 14 years of marriage Kit and Dickie separated, they had not had any children.

Kit continued to run the crystal and china shop eventually opening a second shop in Lavenham which she had for a few years. After closing the shops Kit worked part time as the secretary at Framlingham Modern School. She was there for 8 years before eventually retiring.

She was a member of the English Speaking union and an avid letter writer. She was also lucky enough to have a couple of books published. Kit would not hesitate to write to Government officials or the Prime Minister on anything she did not agree with, especially the giving of honours to pop singers or any other non-worthy recipient. Kit would often return letters that my children Paul and Claire had written to her, correcting in red pen any spelling mistakes and grammatical errors; embarrassingly I had already checked them.

She was a great animal lover, first having a dog named Flonky-Poo, I have no idea where that name came from! But her love grew for cats and over the years had many of her own. Every year she would hold a coffee morning in the garden at Manly to raise funds for the Cats Protection Charity. To give the event more publicity she endeavored to invite a dignitary and in 2007 The Right Honourable Ann Widdecombe attended as guest of honour and due to her presence helped raise £907 that year alone.

Kit remained at Manly for the rest of her long 101 years, the last couple of years being bed ridden. By then she was very deaf and totally blind in one eye and the only means of communication with her, was to write everything down for her in very large writing on a note pad she kept by her side. During this time Kit often said to me she no longer wished to be here. Her wish has now been granted.


